More exciting news, Pastor Jamie and Tiffany Nunley from Victory Church, Thomasville, GA are going to Hungary and will minister at A Haz this month. We know their trip will be a mutual blessing.

For our Thanksgiving feast, we will have a military wife and her 3 young children join us. Her husband is deployed. All the single guys we invited are heading home to be with their families.
