My staff is in contact with our youth, making sure they and their families are doing well. Four of my staff went to Gaza, a 14-hour round trip, to visit Nando and his family and began the process of choosing 6 new youth from Gaza to enter the project next year. Because God blessed the ministry financially, we were able to buy rice, tea, soap, sugar, and oil to help their families during this crisis. Our staff was received well, blessed with breakfast, and then the family killed a goat to feed them before returning home. They sent fresh cashews to each of our staff, which is a BIG gift. They pick, cook, and shell them and then sell them to support the family. It was truly a blessed time of giving and receiving. Next week my staff and I will travel to Catembe (The Bush) to visit more of our youth. I am excited as I miss them all so much and I will have more awesome pictures to share with you later!

We have now been on quarantine for 4 months. They have extended it another month as our numbers keep rising. There are now over 1,000 cases in Mozambique and we have had only eight deaths. Praying for the entire world is the greatest weapon we have.

Bless all who read this newsletter and their family. May their cups run over with blessings and touch others' lives.
