"Just got your letter today about driving to Kansas. It is interesting how we listen to God and find ourselves amongst believers near and far. When you mentioned going to minister to 1, I remembered when Jerome was having such a hard time for weeks. He said, "If Mike Bradley was here, he'd help me." The next day (Sunday) we were standing at the front door of LCA and Lo and Behold, you and Shirley are getting out of the car! Thank you for spending time with us that day to comfort and listen to Jerome."

Please continue praying for Shirley as she struggles with TMJ issues, three times since June 23 the disc in her jaw has slipped out of place. The pain has been intense. She has been seeing both a dental specialist and an Atlas orthogonal chiropractor who understands the issues of TMJ on the rest of the body. TODAY, she got a healing touch from the Lord as she woke up free from headaches that had lasted for 13 days as well as relief from shooting, jabbing pain from nerves adjusting to the adjustments. Last night it was one more night of trying to find ANY comfortable place to sleep. The slightest movement would send the nerve endings off with excruciating pain. We had repeatedly used heat as directed with very little relief. I was willing to try anything to help her, I did wonder about her request to bring up to her 2 cans of soup a small one and a large one. She carefully laid her head on her nearly flat goose down pillow and propped the cans on each side of her neck. This was a GOD solution, those soup cans kept her neck in place. She slept. Tears no longer ran down her face. THANK YOU, JESUS!!! Worthy of His praise also is the good news that Shirley had a laser procedure on her eye that had received a new lens because of cataracts. It had developed fluid behind the lens like mine had and her eyesight had greatly diminished to 20/70 and 20/80. She likened it to having rubbed Vaseline on both sides of her lenses. She is now seeing 20/25 in her right eye and doesn't have to wear glasses except for reading. Like me, she hasn't had that kind of eyesight since she was a young child. The Ophthalmologist has now scheduled outpatient surgery for her left eye on December 7 for cataract removal. We are grateful to the Lord and encouraged.

We are seeing in the weekly pictures from A Haz that the students are finding their way back into fellowship again with new faces that we haven't seen before. The State Department has raised the threat level from 1 to 2 this last week because of COVID issues in Hungary. Thank you for your prayers for the A Haz congregation and Pastor Misi and his family. We received this morning an email from Emese, Misi's wife. They have discovered a lump in her breast and she will find out in a couple weeks the recommended diagnosis and what needs to be done. Thank you for praying for her for Father's peace and His healing in her body.

Thank you for your love and participation with us in Father's work. Your prayers and encouragement and your sacrifices in helping to support us are such an encouragement to us. May Father bless you as He has promised as you follow the leading of His Spirit. May He supply your needs and exceed your expectations as you seek Him first. We love you dearly.
