ROADS OF HOPE **IN MOLDOVA**

God blessed us with a strong network of church partners in Ukraine and Moldova through which Roads of Hope has provided front-line care to

thousands of fleeing refugees. We were the

first American NGO to help at the Ukrainian/Moldovan border. We currently operate:

- Two centers that provide 350-400 refugees with shelter, safety, and daily meals.
- 47 children's homes that provide daily care and safety to 400+ orphans and young mothers with babies.
  - 2,100+ meals being prepared and served per day.
  - We also have provided more than 200 orphans and individuals with logistical intel that helped them escape the Russian military.
  - We have provided life essentials to orphans, sick children, the elderly, and the military inside Ukraine.

the heart of Ukraine's war zone while all lights and phones were

turned off to evade being fired upon. The daring rescue took 38

and Ukraine have been enemies for decades, but now the Hungarians have welcomed Ukrainians with compassion and generosity. For many years, Torch Church has also served Hungarian Gypsy congregations; they are now serving Ukrainian Gypsies too.

Daniel recently wrote: "We are helping refugees with transportation, food, and shelter. We pray for them too! After they are settled, we offer different Christian programs: a kids program, counseling, etc. We hope to open a house for 30-40 people."

Globe has sent funds to help this effort. Thank you for being a part of a global outreach that is showing the love of Jesus in this time of need.

## **RELIEF FROM GERMANY**

We have worked with refugees for seven years, but never with Ukrainians. Now Ukrainian refugees are everywhere!

- 1. We help to organize shipments to Ukraine: Food, necessities, and other essentials... like two large 50 KW generators that provide electricity at refugee centers.
- 2. In March our church welcomed 75 refugees, mostly from Ukraine. To solve communication challenges German to Ukrainian – we bought headsets for translators!
- 3. A Ukrainian lady and her 13-year-old son are now living in our rental apartment. We are helping them adjust to their new life here.
