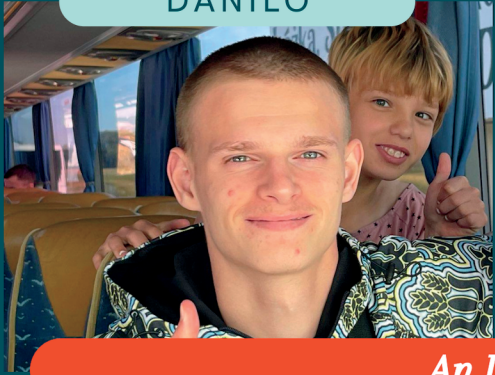

An Urgent Letter from Eastern Europe

Danilo is a 17-year-old Ukrainian orphan and an elite high school wrestler. He is deaf and unable to speak. After Russia attacked Ukraine and missiles struck near his orphanage, Danilo was put on a train to Poland with a group of special needs orphans. We have been visiting Danilo and the other 99 orphans he now lives with. Each child has the same tragic story: Born with special needs. Abandoned at birth. Raised in an orphanage without love. Attacked by Russian military. Escaped to Poland. Now living in uncertainty as refugees in a foreign land, and tragically . . .

Maria and Lenuta are twins who live at Emmanuel House in Moldova. The twins recently started college, fulfilling a fairy-tale dream, thanks to Roads of Hope donors. Sadly, their dream is now in jeopardy because Russia is threatening a takeover and has troops nearby. Moldova is reliant on Ukraine for electricity and Russia for fuel to heat homes. Both energy sources were cut off from Moldova in recent weeks resulting in very cold nights for Maria, Lenuta, and the 247 other children living in our 26 orphan homes*.

WITHOUT HEAT, THE CHILDREN ARE GOING TO FREEZE, MANY WILL GET SICK, AND SOME COULD DIE.

Our children are in desperate need of warm shoes along with coal and a generator with fuel for each home. Pam and I are giving as much as we can over the next four months. We can't let orphaned children live in the cold while we live in comfort and are able to help. As Christians, God instructs us to provide help to orphans in crisis.** Right now, the orphans of Ukraine and Moldova might be facing the greatest crisis in the world. Together, we can help them.

In addition to providing winter comfort to the children, I would like to also give them a joyful Christmas. With your help, we can provide every child with their own Christmas gift, and we can provide Christmas boxes full of goodies to refugee families and orphan homes. These gifts and boxes will demonstrate your love and bring great hope to each child, family, or home.

Please prayerfully consider helping. We need to raise a total of \$158,000 as quickly as possible to purchase these critical needs.
