No Words-Know Words - Recently I learned about five children in Masatepe, a community known for woodworking, who are deaf and/or mute and have no language in which to communicate. One is a 14 year old boy whose name is Jeremias. Jeremias was abandoned by his mother when he was very young. He lives with his great-grandparents and attends a local school but is not provided with any support for his learning needs. Jeremias also works in the fields to help support his great-grandparents. Jeremias is mute. During our conversation with his family, he was attentive with his eyes but did not speak or use facial expressions. His fixed expression is gentle and serene. I could only guess what he was thinking but I felt a connection as I shared with him and his family about a different kind of language made by using signs with your hands. We then demonstrated a conversation in sign language. Other deaf/mute children in the community are teens and one is a toddler only 2 and 1/2 years old. Pray with us as we begin working with families in this new community. It's a step by step process as each family must learn basic sign language together, and then join a community group/class. Did you notice that the word 'community' is similar to 'communication'? These children will have a community in which they can communicate! And they will 'hear' the good news of Jesus Christ! 'Open your mouth for the mute, for the rights of all who are destitute.' Proverbs 31:8

After Saturday morning classes, many of the students from the school for the deaf attend our afternoon sewing classes. Jairo is the first male to join our class. This past week he was in his element, sewing as if he had been doing it all his life. Jairo, artistic and kinesthetic, teaches art to other deaf students during the week. Oh, how God loves these beautiful people!
