If a family has three or more children, they are not required to go to war. I know that the Father wants to support his country, but he feels it better to keep his family safe.

They have been here for a couple of months now and are settling in well. The kids are in school and making friends. The parents are going to English classes in hopes to be able to get a job here and will continue to do so by taking summer English classes. Also, the Father is currently taking a computer programming course at one of the colleges.


The sad part is how little they have and how much they have gone through.

In the Ukraine, the father owned his own successful business and the wife has her PHD in history and was a university teacher. To have so much and then to have it all torn away from you- well, it's heartbreaking to even imagine this!

As someone on the board of Overtoun, I had gone to the parents and asked them if they needed anything and if they were doing ok. They expressed to me a few needs, so I spoke to a couple of the leaders at church and the church took up an offering to provide the things they were in need of.

It was so wonderful being able to see their faces when we brought these items to them. They were so grateful!

This month, the family has chosen to go back to Ukraine. The father's mother is not well and they have been told that there is nothing more they can do for her. So, the parents thought it important for the

whole family to say goodbye.

Once they arrived, they sent me a message and told me the crazy and sad stories of what it took just to get to their town.

They had to take an overnight train to their town once they landed in Ukraine and the oldest boy couldn't sleep very well and when the rest of the family woke up the next morning, the son said that he counted six missiles that came and made contact with the surrounding cities while they were travelling through. That next day, the father found out that during the night - there were a total of thirty missiles that made contact in the nearby cities.

An even sadder story is, the mother messaged me a couple days ago and said that they are now bombing the city that they are in. So far, three missiles have landed. They only bomb at night now. She says it is so scary because during the day life is normal and all the shops and things are open but at night, it is so quiet and eery because everyone knows anything could happen. She said to me that everyone is so scared and they cannot wait to be back in Scotland where there is peace.

To me, this is all so heartbreaking!! Before they left, I prayed with the mother and over the family that God would keep them safe and be with them each step of the way. The mother was crying and saying how anxious and afraid that she was. So, my prayer for them each day until they return, is that God's angels will surround them every day and be a wall of protection all around them. Will you join me in praying for them?

In other news; I have been trying to keep up with all of the grass cutting and Paul has been trying to get all of the surrounding trees and bushes cut back for the summer. We are making a good dent in things.


