

She had to get 3 vaccines, which had us cuddling her for a few days, as she didn't want to be put down. Her sleeping schedule also seems to be changing weekly. We love to see her learn as she grows! She has recently been enjoying staring at herself in a mirror during tummy time. She has rolled over a few times, but isn't at the point where she's doing it consistently yet. We are thankful that she is a healthy baby, apart from a few mosquito bites that look worse than they really are. It's exciting, as she seems to be learning something new every day.

This year we will not be the youth pastors at the church we attend. Instead, we will be focusing on starting a ministry, Living Agape. Our goal is to reach the community, showing God's love in practical ways. Starting events since we've gotten back has been difficult, as we've only been able to meet with those working with us once. We felt we needed to clarify our goal with them, and what we want to do, and how God is calling us to work. With those things being clarified, we told those people to pray about continuing to work with us. One of the couples has decided to not continue, and another we are still waiting to meet with. Our goal is to have all the activities started by the end of March, but it will depend on when doors start opening, and when God puts people in our path to collaborate with us. Pray with us as we make decisions going forward.

For the past few years we have been interns with Globe International. Starting in March, we will officially be missionaries under them, and we are so excited! The main change will be our budget, as before we were receiving only what we spend, and now we will be receiving a 'salary.' Our goal is to raise \$5,500 per month.
